## From Pastor Rob

I have been thinking a lot lately about grace.

Grace is one of the foundational stones of our faith practice. We proclaim that Jesus was God's gift to the world because, through Jesus, God would eliminate the power of sin to alienate us from God.

Jesus is God's living compassion for us. God recognizes that we are imperfect, prone to mistakes, and often blind to our own imperfections. God first gave an encyclopedic set of commandments to Moses by which the covenant



people—Israel—would live as God wants all people to live, namely in life defined by the worship of God as the center of all being, and living with one another in the human community through compassion, grace, mercy, and generosity. Israel would be a living example for all the rest of the world as to how God wanted us to live and why God wanted us to live that way.

But they were unable to do it. Nor could we. Human beings tend to turn inward, prioritizing that which makes life better for ME, ignoring that such focus hurts other people and keeps us from really being who we are. We want to do what we want. We want to have what we want. We want to protect what we have from everyone else. We find ways to shore up our own pride by denouncing others or creating levels of importance, worth, and value, making sure we are on top, and everyone else is firmly below. Oddly, the more we have, the more insecure we become. Fear then leads us to wall ourselves off from others. Reading scripture, we see this happen to Israel; but we also, if we are honest, recognize an awful lot that is completely familiar to our own world.

The result—we could not and cannot save ourselves.



So God sent Jesus to be one of us, one for us, and one with us. He showed us that it is possible to live a life that is nothing but embodied self-sacrificial, other-centered (instead of self-centered) compassion. He lived this compassion to its completion, even offering his life for everyone else. God accepted that work as reconciliation. There would be peace between God and humanity.

Faith is trusting it to be so, no more, no less. We do not earn salvation. We do not work ourselves into sainthood. We do not bargain with God. We do not create a worthy resume to present to God. No, we see that, in Christ, all is done, we simply need to believe it to be so.

All is well, all shall be well.

What a miracle.

We, then, respond by going and doing likewise. To offer our thanks to God, we do everything in our power to live by the same compassion that saved us. We realize that every person we meet needs this same good news, the same opportunity to find freedom from all that alienates and isolates, and to know that they, too, are beloved children of God. There is no greater gratitude to be offered to God.

Then can come another miracle.

## Hunter's Thoughts



Something I have not done a lot of in my role at MCPC is work with the youth. Andrea has been such a wonderful leader for them that I have been able to keep my focus elsewhere, only occasionally getting to teach a Confirmation class or be part of VBS or Easter Egg Hunts. I have been amazed from the sidelines as I have watched some of the young people work at Rise Against Hunger or Room In The Inn. And Graduation Sunday has become particularly meaningful as we hear what this church and congregation mean to them.

This year, I had the opportunity to attend the Montreat Middle School Conference with seven of our middle schoolers and two other adults. I had never been to this before, though my own children loved it when they were in youth groups. (Though it is sponsored by Montreat, it actually takes place at Maryville College in Tennessee. This is because there are so many High School youth at the Montreat conference that they run out of room - what a great problem to have!)

More than 500 middle schoolers from around the country (along with their adult leaders) took over the college campus for 5 days and 4 nights. Rarely are so many Presbyterian Church mini-buses gathered in one parking lot! The energy was amazing and only built through the time there. On that first evening, some of our kids expressed anxiety about the next day when they would meet their small groups. They would be all new people - what would they be like? By the end of the conference, every one of them talked about how the small groups had been the highlight because of all the new friends they have made.

Along with friendships and fun, it was wonderful to see so many young people be willing to talk about their faith. They asked great questions; they listened to each other; and they shared God's love all around. The theme of the conference was "Igniting A Spark", and you really could see these kids listening and learning during keynote speeches, worship, and small groups. I am sure that our high schoolers are getting a similar experience at their conference.

I was blessed to be with Amanda Booth and Katie Moore, both of whom were veterans of being adult leaders for the conference. And I'm so thankful to Adelynn, Brooklyn, Helena, Hope, Jessica, Ruby, and Sophia for letting me participate with them in such a great experience. (They gave me the moniker "Montreat Mom" - I'm not sure whether to be flattered or not.....) What a blessing to get to be part of such energy, faith, and commitment!

#### Dear MCPC Quilt Ministry


Thank you so much for my prayer quilt.

Our funding was is a surplus position during the pandemic because of lower needs but now the schools are back to normal and we are preparing many more backpacks. Not to mention higher grocery prices! Below is a listing of what typically goes in each backpack, based on 4 children per backpack.

- 1 can of Hunts spaghetti sauce.
- 1 package of pasta
- 2 cans of Spaghettios
- 1 Can of chicken
- 2 cans of veggies
- 2 Cans of beans
- 4 top ramen
- 1 Box of Mac and Cheese
- 4 fruit cups
- 4 packs of oatmeal
- 4 packs of gritts
- 1 box of rice or potatoes





We are doing backpacks this summer start in July for a couple of times in the month.

Special Thank you of Circle of Rebekah and Mary/Anna for the contribution to be able to do backpacks for the summer.

As you can see we only buy necessities but with 80 children for Parkside and up to 30 for Mallard Creek costs add up quickly. Granola bars, cookies and chips are only put in when donated. As the school year begins we are asking for monetary donations or food to keep this ministry going. Contributions can be made online or via check made payable to Presbyterian Women, noting "Backpack Blessings" in the memo line.
