We are again in the Holiday Season. Some folks in my neighborhood began stringing their Christmas lights even as they took down their Halloween decorations. It felt a little weird, though, as most of the trees in our corner of the world still had their leaves, and some of those were still the deep green of summer. A snowman in 80 degree sunshine just didn't feel right.

In the life of faith, we are in Advent—the time of preparation to welcome anew the Christ Child into the world.

And do we need him...

Wars rage. Earthquakes rumble through different corners of the world. We are already into an election cycle that I do not think anyone much is enjoying.



We need the light, joy, promise, possibility, and, yes, peace of the Nativity. It is a gift from God as refreshing as a deep breath—a pause to catch ourselves and stop for a minute.

I hope we can all do that this December. I hope we can find moments when we can just sit still, look at the twinkling lights, enjoy a cup of a favorite holiday beverage, sing a carol, or just sit with a beloved and soak in the season.

We are offering some moments where we might do that-

the children are presenting a wonderful, laughter-filled musical on December 3 at 930 am;

the choir is singing us into Christmas with their cantata on December 17 at 1030 am; on Christmas Eve, we are offering three chances to worship the Christ child at 1030 am,

500 pm, and 700 pm; each with little different spin on the Nativity...

—so take a break and join with us in the celebration.

But I also hope you can just spend some time with the story itself. For this year, I would recommend you peruse the story in the Gospel of Luke. Start with Ch. 1, reading about how the Baptist was a miracle child in his own right, bringing joy to a couple who believed themselves long past such moments. Continue with the story of Mary, marveling at the faith of a remarkable young woman who willingly became an instrument of God no matter the risks doing so brought. Then go right into the wonderfully familiar story of Bethlehem, the manger, the angels, and the shepherds. Let the 'good news of great joy' fill your heart and soul, carrying your spirit right through the month.

## Hunter's Thoughts

The Advent Season brings so much to do and to plan and to prepare. Seems we have just gotten the table cleared from Thanksgiving when we start to decide who will bring what for the Christmas meal. And all of the gold and rust and brown decorations are getting traded out for the red and green and white. At this time of year, we tend to just jump from one major event to another. It is equally exciting and exhausting.



What I have to remind myself to do each year is to appreciate the anticipation. That can mean the quivering excitement of a child waiting to see Santa or shaking boxes under the Christmas tree. It can be the expectation of seeing family members who are seen far too infrequently. It can be the suspense and excitement of what that special present may be.

All of these are part of it for me. But I also try to remember the quiet anticipation of hope. And that hope can be so many different things for each of us - hope for improvement, hope for rescue, hope for clarity, hope for renewal. It can be hope for reconciliation, hope for comfort and peace, or even the hope to feel the joy of each new day. But most of all, I think it is the hope of a deepening connection with God.

The word "advent" implies "approach" or "emergence" or "development" - words that in themselves don't seem to have much emotion to them. Yet when I think of the hope that was in the hearts of those people waiting for the Messiah 2000 years ago, the words carry much more significance. People who had felt oppression and separation and even abandonment were struggling to feel connected to God. But when they could read from Isaiah and some of the other prophets about the one who was to come, they could feel some hope. And that gave them something to anticipate.

My prayer for all of us this Advent Season is that we can allow the hope to emerge and develop around and within us. I pray that we can avoid the pitfalls of "just getting through the holidays" so we can be "back to normal". Instead, let us be in the moment of anticipation - not dread or exhaustion. Let us look forward to the coming of the Christ child in our lives in new ways that we cannot predict or even plan for. But we can anticipate, knowing that the love of God will continue to be shown in both familiar and brand new ways for all of us.

May you and yours have a blessed time of Advent.

• Tell her the stock is being transferred. She will then show your gift on the church records when the stock transfer is completed. You must call her as UBS does not send her the name of the donor. Also tell her which fund or project the gift is to be applied to.

### Year End Tax Tips

It's that time of year again when leaves are falling and the holidays are upon us. Many people take this time to try and help their tax situation for 2023 by using charitable gifts to lower their taxable income.



There are several ways you can accomplish this goal:

**1.) Outright gifts of cash or checks to charity.** This may help lower your taxable income if you are able to itemize, but the standard deduction is so high now, gifts to charity made with cash or checks may not help lower your taxes.

**2.) Gifts of stock to charity.** This can help lower your taxes if you gift stocks that have a low basis. If you sell the stocks yourself, you may realize capital gains that are taxable, but if you gift the stocks to charity and they sell them, there is no capital gain. Gifting stocks may not provide a reduction in your current taxable income if you are not able to itemize, but it can lessen the impact of future taxes by eliminating capital gains.

3.) Gifts made to charity using the Qualified Charitable Distribution. If you are 70.5 years or older and would like to support a charity, consider making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) up to \$100,000 directly from an IRA to a qualified charity. A QCD keeps IRA distributions from impacting your adjusted gross income (AGI) now and in the future. It works whether you take the standard deduction or itemize deductions, and it can count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD), if you have one.
