From Rev. Rob Watkins:

As Lent opens for us at Mallard Creek, many folks among us feel like we are truly in a time of examination, testing, and challenge.

We tackled an important and yet difficult task in examining our by-laws, trying to form a consensus that is reflective of who we are, what we believe, and how we practice being disciples; but at the same time, recognizing and living with the diversity in our community.



Some would argue this is an impossible task. Our context

seems to continually communicate that impossibility in its harsh partisanship, its fostering of deep divisions between different groups of people (e.g., rural vs. urban, rich vs. poor, one race against another, elite vs. "regular," and any other division or designation found on cable news), and its message to refuse to cooperate or even interact with someone different from oneself. Therefore, why bother to try at all to find a consensus?

Because Jesus.

Jesus gave the greatest and best mission statement ever written— You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind; and you shall love your neighbor as yourself. (Mt. 22:37-39; Mk. 12:30-31; Lk. 10:27)

It is a mission statement he intends us to actually practice, and he even gives a practical way in which to live by it—

Do unto others as you would have them do unto you. (Mt. 7:12; Lk. 6:31)

This Lent, let our aim be to live into, first, Jesus' mission statement, and, second, to put it into practice by doing unto others as we would have them do to us. Love can reign within our fellowship, Love can bring unity. Love can overcome impossibilities.

Pastor Alison's Care Corner

While we've certainly made progress, it seems to me that that we as people of faith still have a long way to go in the way that we think about and talk and feel about mental illness. Just hearing the words "mental illness" still conjures up images that are extreme, unkind, untrue, and, frankly, unhelpful. Chances are that we all know persons diagnosed with mental illness: family, neighbors, friends, co-workers, ourselves.

An approach that some persons of faith take is that of attempting to pray away symptoms of mental illness, the thought being that if my faith were strong enough, my illness would go away. But do we take this same approach with our physical illnesses? Of course we don't. So why do we treat illnesses of the brain (which is what mental illness is) so differently? When we do, we only shame ourselves and others who suffer.



To worsen matters, the Church, both Protestant and Catholic, has a horrendous history of deeming those with mental illness as being demon-possessed, a practice that causes me to cringe. What causes me to cringe even more is that this kind of warped thinking still exists. To this day, exorcisms still take place. What damage we inflict in the name of faith!

My sense is that symptoms of mental illness frighten us. Often these symptoms are invisible; we look the same, sound the same, act the same - at least to those who do not know us very well - but inside we can be in excruciating and debilitating pain, even to the point of no longer wanting to live. And we suffer silently and alone.

Some of you have taken the brave step of sharing with me your own struggle with mental illness, and what a gift it is that you trust me with such a tender part of your person story. Now I want to return the favor: about twenty years ago I was diagnosed with a form of depression. My mother suffered from it, as did her mother, as does an uncle. Although it has taken some tinkering, I am on a regime of medication which keeps my symptoms manageable. Without medication, my life is an existence at best; with medication, my life is worth living!

We are better as a community of faith when we risk being vulnerable, when we share tender parts of our stories with one another; otherwise, we remain basically a group of polite acquaintances whose connections with one another don't run that deeply. God placed us here to be companions with one another, to bond with one another, to care deeply for one another. May we grow into God's desire for us and experience the richness of deeper human connections within our community of faith.






