Easter comes about as early as it can possibly come. The early Church set the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox as the date for Easter, which is why it moves around so much, falling anywhere from late March until late April. This year—that full moon comes right on top of the equinox—so Easter comes bright and early.

Easter is all about the gift of new life and new being. It flows right into all the seasonal changes we see all around us. I was aware in late February of the coming blossoms of spring—my neighbors daffodils sprang up the week after Valentines Day! Already trees are greening up, buds speckle the ground, and grass will soon need mowing. Life seems unstoppable.

Until it does.

All of us are aware of things that have happened recently that made life come to a halt. Families lost loved ones; people endured illnesses; and some dealt with all manner of tragedy. Despite all the signs of the indefatigable nature of life, we almost daily confront its fleeting nature, its frailty, and its fragility. That can become overwhelming and incomprehensible. We can begin to feel lost, lonely, and afraid.

Easter answers all of that. It's God's great answer that God will not allow life to simply fade away or blink out in a flash. Instead, God wills that life continue, flourish, and erupt wherever God chooses for it do so. The world sought to silence Jesus, end his presence, and be free of him. The cross was meant to be a final end. But God saw otherwise, turning the cross from an end into a beginning—the New Creation dawned upon us, and it continues to shine brightly before us, leading us onward and always toward communion with God.

Allow that good news to take hold of you, whatever you face or even despite all that is endured.

God will not leave us to simply ride out our time on earth. Rather, God continually offers more moments, new opportunities, and countless possibilities, day in and day out, always and forever, until we find our places within the great Communion of Saints.

Go outside. Breathe deeply. See the new life blossoming all around us. Resurrection happens.

May Easter guide us and keep us always.

Worship with us throughout Holy Week.

Hunter's Thoughts

Last week, I had the chance to spend a few minutes holding a 6 day old baby. That is not something I get to do very often – in fact, it's probably been several years since I have held one that young. Being around so many people each day – particularly when I am in and out of hospitals – I always worry about the germs I might have all over me. But when I did get the chance to hold this beautiful little boy, I immediately found myself doing that gentle sway – slowly shifting my weight from one foot to the other. I didn't even realize I was doing it for several minutes. It was muscle memory from when my own children were babies. Looking down at that sleeping face and those tiny fingers, I found myself feeling so hopeful.

Not that I don't often feel hopeful, but this was special. Like many of us, I encounter sad situations on many days - times when I feel like I have no way to improve the circumstances of the moment. It can leave a person feeling alone and helpless. And when the situation is caused by something so beyond our understanding or compassion, that compounds the feelings. At those moments, we can feel most distant from God. One time I heard someone say it was like having a bad connection on a phone line – you sort of know someone is on the other end, but you can't effectively communicate and end up just trying to yell over the static.

Recently, I had a few days where it felt like that. I realized how lonely that feeling can be. Disconnected – or at least, a very poor connection.

Thankfully, I was not alone. It was more like, in my own distress, I was looking right beyond God's presence – but it was there. God is there in the people who gather to offer support in desperate times. God is there in the face of a baby being held by a great-grandmother. God is there in the determination of people who want to see things be better than they are and refuse to give up. God is there in the words of the Lord's Prayer or Psalm 23 that we can fall back on when we can't calm our mind enough to find any other way to express ourselves.

Yes, there have been some very difficult times recently.

But God is here.

God has been here.

And God will be here.


Our initial registration for the 2024-2025 school year has ended and we are already FULL for the next school year. We have started waiting lists in all classes so if you haven't signed your child up, call




