November brings the annual call to pause for a moment and give thanks—

- give thanks for opportunities and possibilities

- give thanks for time off
- give thanks for daily bread
- give thanks for good health
- give thanks for wise physicians who were there in illness

And on goes a list that could nearly infinite.



Each day brings something or someone for which to be thankful. God's grace knows no season or day—it is always there. Even in our darkest moments grace shines forth. Sometimes we can't see it. Sometimes we can't feel it. But that doesn't change the fact that God is present as is God's grace.

Of course, on the best days, we are sometimes so caught up in the celebrations that we miss the grace that made it possible. Saying thank you slips past without being said.

So let's reconnect with our lives for a moment...for what are you grateful for right this moment? Where is a little light shining right now? The step back a couple steps—what happened yesterday or the day before that made something happen today? Who helped? Who went with us? Who listened? Who offered a piece of wise counsel?

Then step back even further...what are the moments for which you are the most grateful? What people? Who has meant the most?

Now take a bit of a sidetrack...for what are you grateful that it is over? What are you glad is in the past never to return?

Sometimes grace takes a detour.

It is interesting to me how often in the scriptures God takes something not so good and makes it good. One of the most profound is the moment when Joseph is reunited with his eleven brothers in Egypt. Remember they sold him into slavery because of his coat of many colors, but God used that to save the whole family and a whole bunch of Egyptians, too (Gen. 37-50). And the core of our faith is built on just such a moment—the cross—the single worst moment in human history when we sought to be rid of God and his Son—yet God redeemed the whole of creation through that terrible moment.

God is good and grace abounds.

There is always something for which to be thankful, even if we may not see it at the moment. Therefore, let us give thanks and sing, just as the hymn suggests.




We are so thankful for our Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church family and hope that each of you have a wonderful and blessed Thanksgiving surrounded by your family and friends!

Do You Know About Qualified Charitable Distributions? Supporting Charity Through Your IRA

If you are 70.5 years of age or older, you have a unique opportunity to support charitable organizations while also managing your financial situation. By making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) of up to \$108,000 directly from your IRA to a qualified charity, you can contribute to causes you care about in a tax-efficient manner.

Benefits of a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

- QCDs help ensure that your IRA distributions do not impact your adjusted gross income (AGI), both now and in the future, which means you pay no taxes on that part of you RMD (Required Minimum Distribution)
- This option is available whether you choose the standard deduction or itemize your deductions on your tax return.

If you are subject to a required minimum distribution (RMD), a QCD can count toward fulfilling that requirement.

Key Considerations

Making a QCD is a straightforward way to support your favorite charities while managing your retirement account distributions efficiently.

To make a QCD to Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church, ask your brokerage firm or bank that manages your IRA to make a qualified charitable distribution to Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church by completing a form they will have or requesting an outgoing check.

BACKPACK BLESSINGS Every Week During the School Year

Thanks to the dedication of Maria Menconi and her volunteers, on October 1, we began our 12th year of Backpack Blessings. We want to thank the Mallard Creek family for the contributions made during the 2024-2025 school year; the program absolutely cannot continue without your support! This past year we averaged about 60 backpacks a week, with each containing food for 4 children.

Our expenses have been about \$700.00 a week.

This school year is going to be especially challenging, as Parkside Elementary has merged with another school and will have around 720 students, up from about 330 last year. As a result, the food needs will be even greater; and we'll prepare 116 bags each week. Parkside has also changed its name to Dorothy J Vaughn Academy of Technology at Parkside. We will continue to provide backpacks for University Meadows.

This program has been supported by the generous donations of church members. Due to the Current situation with SNAP, and the growing number of bags as well as the rising food prices, your continued donations are even more important, and appreciated. While there are many worthwhile projects to support - both in and out of the Mallard Creek family-serving the children in our immediate area is one of the best ways to spread Christ's love around us.

LION'S CLUB GLASSES COLLECTION Lions Recycle for Sight

The Mission Committee will be collecting gently used prescription and reading glasses to be given to the Lion's Club.

Usable Glasses Can Make a Difference! Lions and Leos help to conserve sight by providing usable eyeglasses to children and adults throughout the world. Why Recycle Glasses? An estimated 120 million people* are visually impaired because of uncorrected refractive errors (far and near sightedness). Almost all cases can be corrected and normal vision can be restored with eyeglasses, contact lenses or refractive surgery. The lack of eyeglasses denies children and adults opportunities for education, employment, and a better quality of life.

The collection of eyeglasses for recycling is an on-going, year-round program involving Lions throughout North Carolina. Reusable plastic frame glasses are sent to a Lions Recycling Center where they are cleaned, tested, classified, and sent abroad to medical missions and welfare agencies for redistribution. Metal frame glasses and scrap metal are sold to a refinery and the redeemed cash is used to help fund the needs of the visually impaired.
