From Pastor Rob

I am returning to church after a month away. I have been to a different part of the world, experiencing new people, and seeing a different way of being. While we share much with our Scandinavian siblings, there is much that is different. They enjoy a morning sauna before going to work, complete with dives into the frigid waters of a fjord, and again at the end of the workday, gathering with friends and family for a time of winding down, sweating, freezing, and getting on with it. They like to roam—even private land is open to roaming visitors so long as they do no harm.

And they are Lutherans. The great cathedrals here are stark, plain, and meant to foster an undistracted, uninhibited connection to God. God is felt in the landscape.

Is that something we experience? Do we find God in the very landscape around us? Are we too distracted to notice God in our midst?

That can happen so easily in a time and place that is so full of distractions. The world is constantly shifting all around us. Even in the month I have been gone, the landscape around the church has changed some more—the towers have multiplied, new swaths of trees are gone, and more new faces are moving in.



Is that distracting?

I think that is where the sauna came into play. Each day, families and friends gather together to connect, to sweat, and to swim. They talk. They talk about the day. They talk about work. They talk about relationships. They laugh. They hoot when they hit the water. They found communion.

And they found focus. They once again regained a vision for the day—a vision for themselves—and a vision for life.

What do we need to do? Put a sauna in the gym? We're missing the ice bath afterwards... Maybe there's something more Mallard Creek can practice. What ways could we build daily communion? What ways could we find connection to one another? What ways can we find God all around us?

These are the questions I want to work on now that I'm back. Will you join with me in exploring them?



Well, we made it through our first month of school with a lot of smiles, hugs, laughter, and a few tears but we made it!



Do You Know About Qualified Charitable Distributions? Supporting Charity Through Your IRA

By making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) of up to \$108,000 directly from your IRA to a qualified charity, you can contribute to causes you care about in a tax-efficient manner.

Benefits of a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

- QCDs help ensure that your IRA distributions do not impact your adjusted gross income (AGI), both now and in the future, which means you pay no taxes on that part of you RMD (Required Minimum Distribution)
- This option is available whether you choose the standard deduction or itemize your deductions on your tax return.

If you are subject to a required minimum distribution (RMD), a QCD can count toward fulfilling that requirement.

Key Considerations

Making a QCD is a straightforward way to support your favorite charities while managing your retirement account distributions efficiently.

To make a QCD to Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church, ask your brokerage firm or bank that manages your IRA to make a qualified charitable distribution to Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church by completing a form they will have or requesting an outgoing check.

BACKPACK BLESSINGS Every Week During the School Year

Thanks to the dedication of Maria Menconi and her volunteers, on October 1, we began our 12th year of Backpack Blessings. We want to thank the Mallard Creek family for the contributions made during the 2024-2025 school year; the program absolutely cannot continue without your support! This past year we averaged about 60 backpacks a week, with each containing food for 4 children.

Our expenses have been about \$700.00 a week.

This school year is going to be especially challenging, as Parkside Elementary has merged with another school and will have around 720 students, up from about 330 last year. As a result, the food needs will be even greater; and we'll prepare 116 bags each week. Parkside has also changed its name to Dorothy J Vaughn Academy of Technology at Parkside. We will continue to provide backpacks for University Meadows.

This program has been supported by the generous donations of church members. Due to the growing number of bags and the rising food prices your continued donations are even more important. While there are many worthwhile projects to support - both in and out of the Mallard Creek family-serving the children in our immediate area is one of the best ways to spread Christ's love around us.

The play was entertaining, we made it home safely, and the day was enjoyed by all.


BBQ TributeSunday, October 19

Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church to Retire the Annual Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church BBQ Organizers of the famous pork barbecue and Brunswick Stew have decided to retire the 93-year old event.

CHARLOTTE, NC (Oct. 1, 2025) – Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church will retire the "granddaddy of barbecues" after a 93-year tradition of successfully funding local and world missions along with supplementing it's building fund. Steeped in history and longtime traditions, it's with heavy hearts to step away. Generational leadership of the four main components of the BBQ has stepped aside and our process simply can't sustain the voids. Everything seems to have a life cycle and for the Mallard Creek BBQ, that life cycle is 93-years.

We want to thank everyone for their devotion and dedication to the glorious mission, and we especially want to thank all of the members of the BBQ Committee both past and present who have represented our congregation so tirelessly through the years to build this strong tradition.

We want to thank the countless thousands of neighbors who have visited the BBQ over the years for good food, fellowship, homecomings of sorts, and contributions to missions to continue to move our Lord's work ahead.

About the Mallard Creek Barbecue

The Annual Mallard Creek Barbecue has been a Charlotte tradition since 1929. The church was under construction building Sunday school rooms when the nation fell into the Great Depression. Unable to pay the contractor, the deacons hosted a barbecue to raise the money. Funds raised were used to make contributions to local and world missions and supplement the church's building fund.
