From Pastor Rob

I know that around here September can feel like summer with 90 degree days, humid nights, and cicadas still in full song, but for me, it always means fall has come. There is something about Labor Day weekend that always makes me feel like we are entering the last lap of the year. Even it is still hot as blue blazes outside, I begin to feel the shifting seasons.

All of our students are back in school at whatever they are from preschool through post-graduate work. Teachers are already hard at work, looking forward to the first fall break.



Wal-Mart has put up the Christmas decorations and you can buy pumpkin spice EVERYTHING everywhere—I still think pumpkin spice belongs in pumpkin pie exclusively—but what do I know?

A few hundred years ago, fall was associated with old age. If you were to read through some of the ancient liturgies of the Church, the turn in calendar from summer to fall meant a winding down, a graying of whatever is, and a season of decline. Interestingly, though, some of those same liturgies did not see this shift as a bad thing. Instead, they saw it as a season of quiet comfort following the hot mess of summer. Biblically, the Old Testament viewed entering the autumn years as a sign of wisdom and accomplishment. If one lived long enough to gain a head of gray hair, then one must surely know how to live. Youth was seen as a frantic, slightly derailed time of life when so much was unsettled, precarious, and outright dangerous. Old age was the time one earned the right to sit in the village gates and dispense the secrets of righteous living.

Maybe we can adopt something similar for ourselves as we enter fall again.

We have made it two-thirds of the way through the year. What have we learned so far? What experiences have we gleaned? Where have there been moments of joy? What have been the struggles?

Maybe we can find time to reflect on our lives, finding the moments of grace.

Then, we can use those reflections to guide the remainder of the year. Perhaps we can even offer counsel to someone still working their way through the challenges life presents this year.

I am glad to move into fall. It is a sure and certain sign of grace yet to come.



Hunter's Thoughts

"Back to School!" That has long been the phrase when people talk about September. That's the way it always was for me. Labor Day will be the last hurrah at the neighborhood pool or the last quick trip to the beach. As soon as Labor Day is past, then we can start back to "normal" schedules of school days and weekends.




But these days, by September most schools have already been in session - some for as much as three weeks! Though my old-fashioned paradigm still has August as an essential part of summer, the times have changed for many. I have watched over the last few weeks as different groups of students have begun their academic year. Some of them have done so with great excitement.....some less so. Seeing the children bring their backpacks to church made it all so much more real for everyone. Watching the preschool teachers prepare their classrooms is really exciting. As Rob mentioned to them during their orientation, the amount of wonderful noise - singing and laughing and playing - is always welcome as the pre-schoolers return. Young adults have already been dropped off at colleges and universities - to the mixture of relief and sadness of their parents. Both of my adult children are beginning new educational programs right now.

I note all those beginnings, but then I turn to worship planning for the next few months and I'm reminded of how different our liturgical calendar is. We will be winding up the liturgical year at the end of November and then beginning anew with Advent in December. We will then go through the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter in a fairly compressed time frame. So this leaves the rest of the year as ... what? We've taken to giving this time of the liturgical year different names - "Proper" and "Ordinary" are two that are most often used. But that can be deceptive, particularly in the care of Ordinary.

Ordinary time is not meant to be thought of as common or unimportant. In fact, it comes from the idea of "ordinal numbers" which means the rank or listing of something, not the sum of it.

(Bored you yet?)

Anyway, I thought about all this as I looked at our worship planning. The seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter could be said to focus on the events in the life of Jesus and the



church. In a way, this "Ordinary" time might be thought of as when we can focus on Jesus' teachings. I know that is an over-simplification, but it helps me sometimes to be reminded that in the midst of the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we must also focus on what he taught us. We're not just marking time until the next "exciting" season of the church year; we are celebrating the extraordinary gift of Christ and all that he taught and continues to teach us.

May Ordinary time be a blessing and challenge and motivation to all of us!
