The holiday season suddenly came out of nowhere—just like it does every year. There is still Halloween candy to be eaten! The fridge is still packed with Thanksgiving leftovers! We have no idea where we put the Christmas decorations for the house last year—remember when it seemed like such a good idea to put them 'somewhere out of the way' last January? Well, guess what? DECEMBER IS HERE!

Hopefully, we aren't all in such a state of holiday panic, and even if we are so well organized we have flow charts and spreadsheets for how the tree, table decorations, gift lists, and party commitments that tell us exactly where or when we are supposed to be, I know the season can bring it's own special stress and angst. We may love Christmas, but there is so much to do!

Let me offer a way into a more silent night as we ready ourselves for Christmas—keep it holy.

I promise that is not a killjoy. It actually can be a way to make our joy more complete, more fulfilling, and perhaps even inject more meaning into all we are doing. Keeping it holy means we approach the celebration of Christ's birth as did his parents, the shepherds, and the magi. That allows us to delve more deeply into the wonder and miracle of Christmas, avoiding a lot of the noise that seems to surround the holiday.

Mary and Joseph met the impending birth of Jesus with mixed emotions. Mary was terrified—this was her first child—she was really young. Yet, she was also full of awe—God had chosen her from among all the women of the world to be the mother of God's Son. There is not one of us who could actually get our heads around that. And there was joy—her first child was on his way! There was the joy of becoming a mother, of bringing life into the world, and feeling that life grow within her. Joseph was at first horrified—how could this happen? He knew he had nothing to do with it. What is this wild story Mary tells? And yet—he also heard the angel—FEAR NOT! This child was no problem—this child was the new beginning of all the world! Mary was not stained, she was BLESSED! Although he could not understand it, he knew there was reason for joy. God was afoot. Things were changing all around him. That was reason for wonder!

The shepherds burst out of the darkness as a riot of joy and welcome. A Savior was born—but not a savior of just the high and mighty; not just a savior for the holiest of the holy—no—this Savior was for all people! Even dirty, grubby shepherds who spent more time with the sheep than inside a house or among people. This Savior was FOR them, WITH them, and ONE of them! That was more than enough reason to wake up the whole town. God was good and grace abounded! Their Savior is also OUR Savior! 'Rejoice, again I say, rejoice!,' sand the Apostle Paul.

The magi shouldn't even be here. They have seen a star in the night sky that shouldn't be there. Suddenly, nothing is what any of them could have expected or that even made sense. This child is a bridge between God and humanity—a spiritual connection that cannot be broken. This child, though, is destined to suffer, becoming one with all who suffer. Through it all, God is changing everything, rewriting the story of humanity, and offering us something new, something holy, and something worthy of worship.

As we think on these reactions and responses to Jesus' coming birth, we find a way to maintain the sanctity of the season. Our joy comes because God is with us. Our joy deepens because God is for us. Our joy is shareable because God has something for everyone.

By making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) of up to \$108,000 directly from your IRA to a qualified charity, you can contribute to causes you care about in a tax-efficient manner.

Benefits of a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)

- QCDs help ensure that your IRA distributions do not impact your adjusted gross income (AGI), both now and in the future, which means you pay no taxes on that part of you RMD (Required Minimum Distribution)
- This option is available whether you choose the standard deduction or itemize your deductions on your tax return.

If you are subject to a required minimum distribution (RMD), a QCD can count toward fulfilling that requirement.

Key Considerations

Making a QCD is a straightforward way to support your favorite charities while managing your retirement account distributions efficiently.

To make a QCD to Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church, ask your brokerage firm or bank that manages your IRA to make a qualified charitable distribution to Mallard Creek Presbyterian Church by completing a form they will have or requesting an outgoing check.

BACKPACK BLESSINGSEvery Week During the School Year

Thanks to the dedication of Maria Menconi and her volunteers, on October 1, we began our 12th year of Backpack Blessings. We want to thank the Mallard Creek family for the contributions made during the 2024-2025 school year; the program absolutely cannot continue without your support! This past year we averaged about 60 backpacks a week, with each containing food for 4 children.

Our expenses have been about \$700.00 a week.

This school year is going to be especially challenging, as Parkside Elementary has merged with another school and will have around 720 students, up from about 330 last year. As a result, the food needs will be even greater; and we'll prepare 116 bags each week. Parkside has also changed its name to Dorothy J Vaughn Academy of Technology at Parkside. We will continue to provide backpacks for University Meadows.

This program has been supported by the generous donations of church members. Due to the Current situation with SNAP, and the growing number of bags as well as the rising food prices, your continued donations are even more important, and appreciated. While there are many worthwhile projects to support - both in and out of the Mallard Creek family-serving the children in our immediate area is one of the best ways to spread Christ's love around us.




