

MCPC 2022 Budget

On October 26, 2021 the MCPC Session adopted our budget for the year 2022. The figures are listed below. Our pledge to work outside MCPC will return to 12% of our weekly offering receipts to the general fund in 2022. This should total about \$89,448 and is shown in the benevolence section of the budget. The work within our church is done by our committees and their budget approvals are listed next. Projected committee expenses are \$287,125 or about 38% of the total budget. The third section of our budget is salaries and employee benefits. This section totals \$376,624. The employee salaries and benefits for 2022 make up about 50% of the budget. The terms of call for the senior pastor will need to be approved by the congregation in January 2022.

The 2022 budget is up \$4,794 compared to this year. It does NOT include monies for debt retirement on the new gathering space. To fund the 2022 budget we will again need the generous support of ALL MCPC members Your officers wish to thank you for your financial support. Any budget questions may be given to the Finance Committee. Thank you again for being a faithfull supporter of the LORD's work at MCPC.

The principal Loan balance on the Gathering Space is \$175,000.
